New Transport Centre for Port Antonio to Solve Traffic Woes

Discussions have started on the construction of a new transport centre for the town of Port Antonio in Portland. This centre is expected to ease the daily traffic congestion and provide additional parking for public passenger vehicles.

A team from Factories Corporation of Jamaica Limited, the Portland Municipal Corporation and Members of Parliament Daryl and Ann-Marie Vaz visited the proposed site in Port Antonio which is owned by the Jamaica Railway Corporation (JRC).

As part of the discussions, a 50-year lease is being sought for the land to construct the transport centre as the anchor with a small integrated manufacturing location among other amenities.

"The transport centre will be cutting-edge. This will show the respect we have for our people and the respect we have for those in the transport sector. So, it's going to be not just the regular parking, it's going to be something everyone in Portland can come and be proud of," said FCJ Chairman Lyttleton 'Tanny' Shirley.

Excited about the new construction and the solution to the traffic congestion in the town, Mrs. Vaz lamented the issues they face daily when commuting through the town, "Where the taxis park is right now in the town, is an inconvenience for everybody ... this development is a clear indication of the growth of the town of Port Antonio. The town is now expanding, and we are moving with the times," Mrs. Vaz said.

The construction of the new transport centre and the redevelopment of Boundbrook are two projects to be executed by FCJ to assist in improving the lives of the people of Portland.

The Boundbrook will be re-developed into an integrated complex, which will provide services offered by public and private sector entities.
